2021-22 Woodside-Leeuwin Cadetship Scholarship

Are you interested in a career at sea?

The Woodside Leeuwin Cadetship Scholarship provides three young people each year with funding to achieve:

- Certificate III in Maritime Operations (Master under 24m Near Coastal)
- Certificate III in Maritime Operations (Marine Engine Driver Grade 2 Near Coastal)
- Certificate of Safety Training (STCW95)
- AMSA Certificate of Medical Fitness
- Sea service and assessment requirements

The aim of this 12-month program is to provide a career pathway into the marine industry for **Leeuwin Volunteers**. Successful applicants are expected to adhere to Leeuwin Ocean Adventure's polices and core values throughout the Cadetship.

During the Cadetship, cadets will be part of the Leeuwin volunteer program and will be supported to complete Certificates III - Master < 24m and Marine Engine Driver 2 (MED2) and associated task books while accruing qualifying service (assessed using the National Standard for Commercial Vessels - refer AMSA).

Proudly funded by Woodside

The Cadetship Scholarships are part of the Leeuwin Marine Career Pathway program proudly funded by Woodside. The program aims to encourage entry by young people into the maritime industry sector.



The program is also supported by Leeuwin Ocean Adventure industry partners who provide work experience and training opportunities as part of the program where possible.

Selection Criteria

Succesful candidates - you must:

- be a Leeuwin Ocean Adventure Member (\$50 per year) and you must have completed a Leeuwin Youth Explorer 7-day Voyage.
- be an Australian resident.
- meet acuity and colour vision and other medical requirements for issue of Master <24m and MED 2 qualifications.*
- be ready to commence the cadetship from 1 March 2021 and be fully committed and available for a 12-month period.
- be rated as, or be capable to quickly become a Leeuwin Ocean Adventure Watch Leader and/or Duty Officer.
- be 18 years of age on or before 30 April 2021.

Successful applicants will be required to sign a contract agreeing to the terms of the scholarship (copy available on request).

*Refer to AMSA guidelines for the medical assessment of Near Coastal Seafarers.

Application process

- Applications open Tuesday 1 December 2020 and will close Monday, 4 January 2021 at 5pm.

 Late applications cannot be accepted.
- Applications must to be sent to the CEO via email: ceo@sailleeuwin.com
- Shorlisted applicants will be called for a panel interview.
- Three full cadetships will be awarded in 2021.

Please note: If the applicant already has one of the aforementioned qualifications, a higher qualification may be considered upon negotiation with Leeuwin Ocean Adventure. The applicant will be required to fund any difference in course fee requirements.

Please note:

- If you do not finish the cadetship you must agree to reimburse Leeuwin Ocean Adventure the Woodside funded program costs incurred within 3 months of withdrawal from the program.
- You must be able to support yourself financially and have alternate accommodation when not on the ship.
- You will be willing to engage in promotional activities of the cadet program and be an ambassador for this Woodside-funded initiative as required.

Application requirements

Please provide a short CV and cover letter including but not limited to the following:

- Leeuwin volunteer involvement (time involved);
- Leeuwin engagement (voyages completed and ratings gained);
- Existing qualifications;
- Existing sea time;
- What you can bring to the Leeuwin cadetship program;
- Future career aspirations;
- Why you should be chosen for the cadetship; and
- How you feel you can be an Ambassador for the Leeuwin Foundation and the Woodside investment in maritime career pathways.
